# **Garda Recorded Crime Statistics**

**2004 - 2008**

## *Introduction*

This publication, *Garda Recorded Crime Statistics 2004-2008*, is the third annual CSO report featuring data recorded on the Garda PULSE (Police Using Leading Systems Effectively) and the FCPS (Fixed Charge Penalty System) systems.

This report builds on last year's annual report which used the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS) to categorise crime, for each year between 2003 and 2007. The ICCS replaced the Headline/Non-Headline classification, with its various sub-groupings, which was used for annual statistics up to 2005.

The current report features detailed information on the volume of offences recorded and detected by An Garda Síochána between 2004 and 2008 in each ICCS offence group. The report also contains more detailed information on offences recorded in 2008, namely relevant court proceedings, convictions, profiles of those convicted and a detailed breakdown of offences by Garda Region and Division. A more regular update on the volume of offences being recorded on the PULSE system is provided in the CSO's quarterly *Recorded Crime* release.

### **Background**

In 2006 the CSO assumed responsibility for the publication of recorded crime statistics from An Garda Síochána. Prior to this, recorded crime statistics were published as part of the Crime Statistics section of Garda Annual Reports. An Garda Síochána ceased including this section in their annual reports from 2006, in recognition that the CSO was to assume this responsibility.

The information supplied in this report refers only to criminal incidents known to An Garda Síochána and recorded as such. Obviously, not every crime comes to the attention of An Garda

Síochána, and the CSO provides additional information on non-recorded crime through its Victimisation surveys.

### **Reference Period: 2004 to 2008**

This publication is based on data that existed as of early-October, 2009, relating to offences recorded between January 1, 2004 up to and including December 31, 2008.

All data recorded on PULSE (and FCPS) has the potential to be revised as additional information becomes available. This is because of the nature of criminal incidents, the nature of the reporting of same by members of the public, follow-up investigations and characteristics of consequential activities by the broader justice system. For this reason, the 2008 data was not taken from the system until October 2009, to allow as much updating as possible to take place. Similarly, data from previous years is also subject to slight changes as more up-to-date information is added to the system.

## Structure of report

1. The detail of the report is preceded by a summary chapter to give readers a broad overview of the main trends in the data for each of the 16 ICCS offence groupings. This information is intended to be indicative of broad trends only for each group at the top level and should be interpreted with reference to the detailed information on specific offences within the group.
2. Each of the 16 ICCS offence groupings is covered in a separate chapter of the report, which provides detailed information on the specific offences within the group.

Each chapter looks primarily at the number of offences recorded and detected within a particular offence group and also the extent to which the volume of offences is increasing or decreasing for that offence-type, over time. Information is provided for each offence in the classification.

Each chapter contains four main tables describing the recorded and detected offences for the group.

Table X.1 – Number of recorded and detected offences, 2004 - 2008

Table X.2 – Court outcomes for offences with relevant proceedings, 2008

Table X.3 – Persons with relevant convictions (by age and sex), 2008

Table X.4 – Breakdown of individual offence types (recorded and detected) by Garda Region and Division, 2007 - 2008

Supplementary tables are added to some chapters to provide more detail on other issues relevant to a particular offence-type (e.g. profile of victims, weapons used, drug types etc.).

If there are technical notes relevant to a particular offence group these are included at the start of the chapter.

The data used for most of this publication originate in the Garda PULSE (Police Using Leading Systems Effectively) and the FCPS (Fixed Charge Penalty System) systems.

## Technical notes

*This section explains some of the technical terms that feature in the report.*

The first table in each chapter contains the volume of 'recorded' and 'detected' offences for each year from 2004 to 2008.

### *Recorded Offences*

Offences reported or which become known to members of An Garda Síochána are recorded when, on the balance of probability, a Garda determines that a criminal offence defined by law has taken place, and there is no credible evidence to the contrary.

If it is subsequently determined that a criminal offence did not take place, the criminal offence recorded is invalidated and is not counted in the statistics. If a person makes a report and subsequently withdraws it by stating that the criminal act did not take place, then this too is invalidated unless there is evidence to suggest that, by reasonable probability, the offence has taken place.

For criminal offences where victim confirmation is required (e.g. assault, fraud), a criminal offence is recorded only where the victim confirms the offence or where there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability it occurred.

Another important feature of a recorded offence is that it is based on the date reported to, or that it became known to, the Gardaí. This has major implications for some offence types. Notable amongst these are sexual offences, as it has often been the case that such offences have been reported to An Garda Síochána many years (sometimes decades) after the event(s). Thus a sexual assault, which occurred in 1960, would be included in the statistics for 2006 if it was first reported in that year.

### *Detected Offences*

Detailed guidelines exist within An Garda Síochána to determine whether a crime incident may be flagged as 'detected'.

The main criteria for classifying an offence as 'detected' is when criminal proceedings have been commenced for at least one person for the offence.

However, there are a number of scenarios where an offence will be considered detected even though criminal proceedings may not be initiated. For these reasons, the number of detected offences exceeds the number of offences with relevant convictions, for some offence groups.

For example:

- Approval may have been granted for a child to be dealt by An Garda Síochána under the Juvenile Diversion Programme, as provided for in the Children's Act 2001, rather than face formal court proceedings.
- An offender may have died before proceedings could be initiated.

- An essential witness may be permanently unable or unwilling to co-operate with court proceedings.

This is not an exhaustive list of the criteria used to mark a crime as 'detected'

### *Relevant Proceedings*

The second table in each chapter of the report describes the 'relevant proceedings' that were commenced for each offence-type in the group.

The decision to take proceedings on the basis of a recorded offence appears to be the most logical conclusion to the life-cycle of an offence. However, the relationship between recorded offences and court outcomes is not straightforward.

The problem is that the charged offence may never have been recorded as an offence on the PULSE system. It can (and does) happen that, at the time of a decision whether to charge, the evidence is such that a different offence is charged to the one originally recorded. Sometimes the offence charged is more serious than the original recorded offence and sometimes it is less serious. Therefore the relationship between the recorded offence and the subsequent proceeding is affected, and this proceeding may not be relevant to the original offence.

The concept of 'relevant proceedings' has been introduced to link the specific primary offence to a relevant court outcome. Decisions have been taken by the CSO as to which proceedings are relevant to the original "counting" offence (*see Counting Rules, Background Notes*).

### *Convictions*

There can be a significant passage of time between a crime incident and any subsequent court outcome. The length of this passage of time is highly dependent on the offence type in question. More serious offences can take longer to investigate and prosecute, whereas many minor offences can be dealt with summarily by the courts. Therefore, it is not surprising that, for some ICCS groups in particular, data on court outcomes is subject to revision each year. For this reason, each table with convictions data includes the number of cases which are pending including those with appeals allowed, to give a more complete picture of the progression of 2008 offences through the system. This data should be considered a snapshot of the court proceedings at a point in time (October, 2009) rather than a final picture of all proceedings brought in relation to offences recorded in 2008.

When a conviction is returned for a particular offence this typically means that an offender has been convicted of that particular offence and some subsequent order has been made. However, convictions (for the purposes of this report) also include cases where the case against an offender is deemed proven but the judge makes an order without a formal conviction, and cases where the Probation of Offenders Act is applied.

### *Persons with Relevant Convictions*

The third table in each chapter provides a profile by age and sex of persons with relevant convictions. It is important to note that there is not a one-to-one relationship between the number of offences with relevant proceedings and convictions (Table 2), and the number of persons convicted (Table 3).

For example, it is possible that two people could be convicted of a homicide offence. Table 2 would show a single homicide offence, recorded and detected, with one relevant proceeding and conviction. However, Table 3 would then provide the age and sex of the two convicted offenders. Consequently the total number of convictions would be slightly different to the total number of persons convicted.

### *Rates per population*

The fourth table in each chapter contains a breakdown of specific offences by Garda Division and District. In addition to containing the absolute numbers of offences recorded and detected, this table presents the rate for each recorded offence type per 100,000 of population, for each division and district. This is simply achieved by dividing the number of offences recorded by the population for the area, and multiplying by 100,000. This provides a common basis for comparing the prevalence of offences across administrative areas of different population size.

### *Garda Regions and Divisions*

The fundamental unit for Garda geography is the level of the Garda Station. Stations are then aggregated to District level, then Division and Region. This geography is unique to An Garda Síochána.

An Garda Síochána have made a strategic decision to, and have begun the process of, moving to county-based geography. This will, in time, facilitate the examination of recorded crime data in the context of data held by, among others, Local Authorities.

# *B*

## *Summary*

This chapter provides a broad overview of the changes in recorded and detected offences across the 16 top level offence groups of the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS) up to the end of 2008. It looks at the short-term trend between 2007 and 2008 and also at the changes in recorded crime between 2004 and 2008.

### **Notes on interpretation**

#### *Classification*

Each ICCS Group is made up of many different types of offence that may not be fully represented in the title of the group. For this reason, it is necessary to examine the detail of each group to determine which particular offences are driving change in the group as a whole.

#### *Percentage change*

The absolute number of offences varies widely from group to group and this must be borne in mind when interpreting percentage change, and making comparisons between groups. For example, in 2008 there were 89 *Homicide Offences* (ICCS Group 01) and 76,863 *Theft and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 08). The same level of percentage change in each of these groups would represent vastly different numbers of recorded offences. See *Table B.1 for percentage change in recorded offences*.

#### *Factors affecting change*

The change apparent in any offence group over time can be caused by many different factors, including for example, criminal behaviour, Garda activity, legislative changes and changes to the classification of particular offences.

## Percentage Change in Volume of Recorded Offences:

### 2007 – 2008

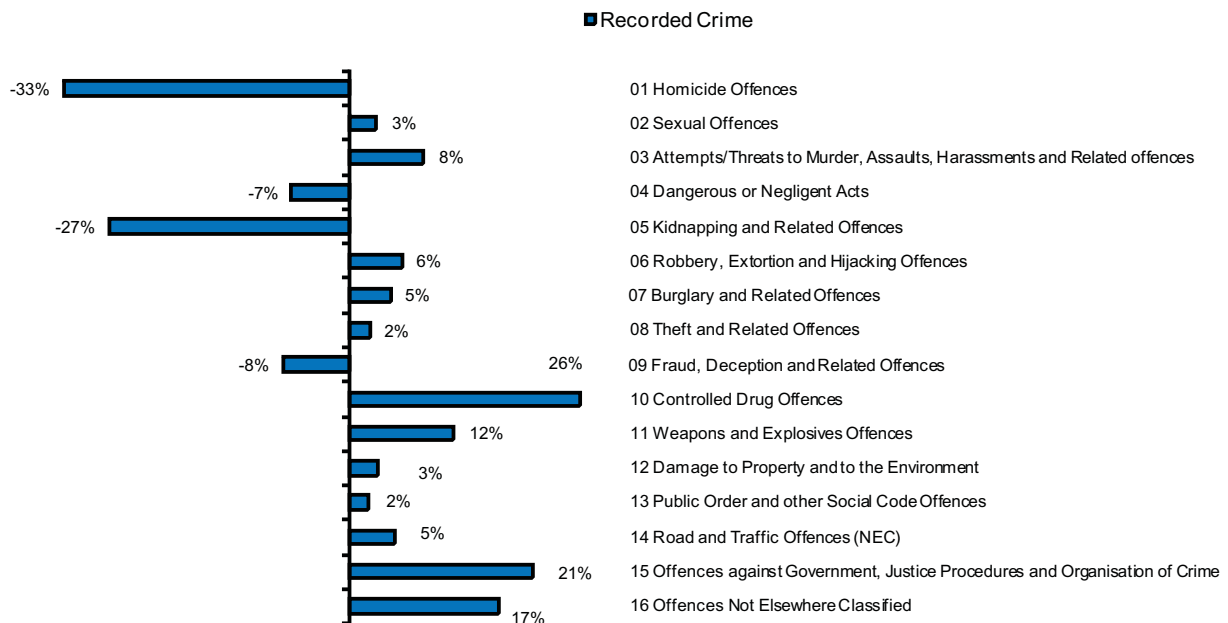
The graph below (Figure B.1) shows the percentage change in the volume of recorded offences in the 16 top level groups, under the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS), between 2007 and 2008. It gives an indication of which offence groups have increased and decreased in 2008, compared with 2007.

The offence groups with the highest percentage increases between 2007 and 2008 were *Controlled Drug Offences* (ICCS Group 10) which increased by over a quarter and, *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation* (ICCS Group 15) which increased by over a fifth.

There were also some decreases in recorded offences between 2007 and 2008, most noticeably in *Homicide Offences* (ICCS Group 01) which decreased by almost a third and, *Kidnapping and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 05) which fell by 27 %.

## Percentage Change in Volume of Recorded Offences:

### 2004 – 2008

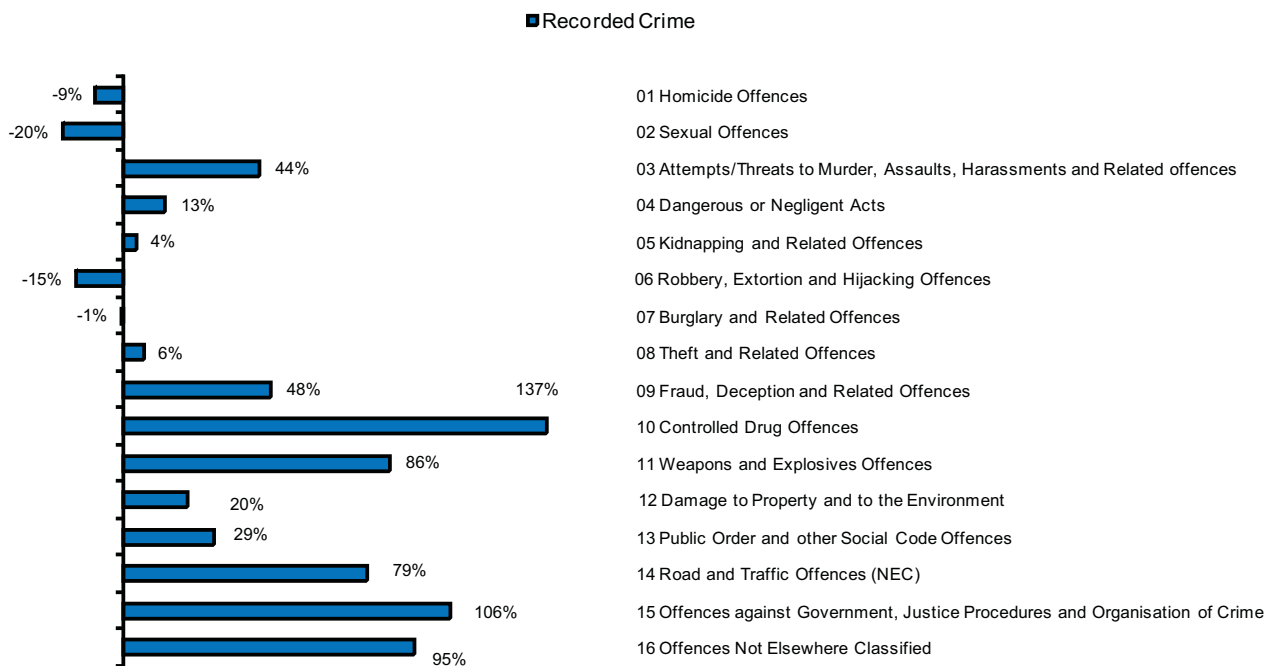
The following section looks at the changes in the offence groups over the longer-term. The graph below shows the rate of change in the 16 main recorded offence groups under the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS) between 2004 and 2008.

There has been considerable change in the volume of offences recorded in a number of groups, in the period between 2004 and 2008. In particular *Controlled Drug Offences* (ICCS 10) increased by 137%, *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation* (ICCS 15) more than doubled (106%) and *Weapons and Explosive Offences* (ICCS Group 11) rose by 86% in this period.

On the other hand the number of recorded *Sexual Offences* (ICCS 02) decreased by one-fifth and *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* (ICCS 06) fell by 9%, between 2004 and 2008.

## Detection rates for Recorded Offences

This section examines the overall detection rate for each of the 16 offence groups in the ICCS, for each year from 2004 to 2008.

### Note on interpretation of detection rates

The detection rates referred to in this section are for an entire group of offences, and detection rates for specific offences will vary within the group, and are affected by relative volumes within the group. It is also important to remember that, as with all PULSE data, detection rates may be subject to revision as more information becomes available to An Garda Síochána. For this reason detection rates for the entire offence group should be considered as indicative of the trend for a whole range of offences, at a particular point in time, and interpreted with caution.

There is little change in the detection rates of most offence groups between 2007 and 2008, apart from the detection rate for *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 09) which is up from 45% in 2007 to 53% in 2008. Over the longer term, detection rates for the majority of offence groups are quite stable in the period between 2004 and 2008. However, it is notable that the detection rates for *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* (ICCS Group 06) increased from 37% to 50% in the period. On the other hand the detection rate for *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 09) is down from 69% in 2003 to 53% in 2007, and the rate for *Homicide Offences* (ICCS Group 01) is also down from 95% to 83%. ### **Summary of the 16 ICCS Offence Groups**

The following gives a short description of the overall trends in recorded and detected offences in each group of offences for 2008.

#### **Note on interpretation**

Each ICCS Group is made up of many different types of offence that may not be fully represented in the title of the group. For this reason, it is necessary to examine the detail of each group to determine which particular offences are driving change in the group as a whole.

#### **01 Homicide Offences**

The number of *Homicide Offences* recorded during 2008 was 89, down from 132 in 2007. In the period between 2004 and 2008 there was a decrease of 9% in the number of *Homicide Offences* recorded by the Gardaí. In 2008, 83% of recorded homicide offences were detected. See *Chapter 1*.

#### **02 Sexual Offences**

There was a 3% rise in the number of *Sexual Offences* recorded by the Gardaí in 2008, compared to 2007. The number of offences recorded rose from 1,366 in 2007 to 1,408 in 2008. The number of *Sexual Offences* recorded in 2007 is down 20% from the number recorded in 2004. The detection rate for recorded *Sexual Offences* in 2008 was 57%, unchanged from 2007, and an increase of 1% on 2004. See *Chapter 2*.

#### **03 Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related offences**

Recorded offences in this group increased by 8% in 2008 from 17,666 in 2006 to 19,152 in 2008, and have increased by almost 44% since 2004. 59% of offences of this type were detected in 2008 which is down slightly from 60% in 2007 and 63% in 2004. See *Chapter 3*.

#### **04 Dangerous or Negligent Acts**

In 2008 there were 238,300 recorded offences in this category, which represents a decrease of 7%. The longer-term trend for this group of offences shows that the number of offences has increased by 13%, in the period between 2004 and 2008. The detection rate for this group of offences is always almost 100%, which is predictable given the nature of these offences. See *Chapter 4*.

## **05 Kidnapping and False Imprisonment**

There were 77 offences recorded in this group in 2008, which is a decrease of almost 27% on the 106 offences recorded in 2007. A detection rate of 57% was attained for offences recorded in this group in 2008 an increase on the detection rate in 2004 which was 54%. See *Chapter 5*.

## **06 Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences**

There were 2,299 *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* recorded in 2008, an increase of 6% on the same figure in 2007. Overall, total offences within this group reduced by 15% since 2004. Detection rates for the whole group have increased each year from 37% in 2004 to 50% in 2008. See *Chapter 6*.

## **07 Burglary and Related Offences**

In 2008, 24,864 *Burglary and Related Offences* were recorded in the state. This is an increase of 5% on the same figure one year previously and an overall reduction of 1% on the comparable figure in 2004. Detection rates have been rising steadily since 2004, from 17% to 26% in 2008. See *Chapter 7*.

## **08 Theft and Related Offences**

More than 76,863 *Theft and Related Offences* were recorded in 2008. The volume of these offences has remained fairly static over the years, increasing by 2% since 2007 and by 6% since 2004. 31% of all *Theft and Related Offences* were detected in 2007 compared to 36% in 2007. See *Chapter 8*.

## **09 Fraud, Deception and Related Offences**

There were 5,411 *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* recorded in 2008. This is a decrease of 8% on the comparable figure in 2007 and an increase of 48% on the same figure in 2004. The overall detection rate for this group was 53% in 2007, a decrease of 16 percentage points on the same rate in 2004. See *Chapter 9*.

## **10 Controlled Drug Offences**

In 2008, 23,405 *Controlled Drug Offences* were recorded, an increase of 26% on the comparable figure in 2007. *Controlled Drugs Offences* have more than doubled (137%) in the period from 2004 to 2008. Detection rates are high for this group, which is predictable given the nature of these offences. See *Chapter 10*.

## **11 Weapons and Explosives Offences**

In 2008 there 4,016 offences recorded in this group. This was an increase of 12% on the 2007 figure and an increase of 86% on the 2004 figure. A detection rate of 91% was attained for this offence group in 2008 and this is very much in line with detection rates for previous years. See *Chapter 11*.

## **12 Offences against Property and the Environment**

There were 44,626 *Damage to Property and to the Environment* recorded in 2008, an increase of 3% on 2007. However, the number of recorded offences has risen 20% since 2004. The detection rate for offences of this nature has remained around 20% in the period between 2004 (19%) and 2008 (22%). See Chapter 12.

## **13 Public Order and other Social Code Offences**

The number of recorded offences in this group rose 2% in 2008, from 60,586 to 61,822. In the period 2004 – 2008 the number of offences rose 27%. The detection rate for offences recorded in this group in 2008 was 93%, which was an increase of 2% on 2007. See Chapter 13.

## **14 Road and Traffic Offences**

There were 332,372 *Road and Traffic Offences* recorded in 2008. This represents an increase of 5% on the comparable figure in 2007. Not surprisingly, given the nature of these offences, detection rates for this group are very high, with 99% of all recorded 2008 offences being detected. See Chapter 14.

## **15 Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Org. of Crime**

Nearly 13,290 *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime* were recorded in 2008, an increase of 21% on the 2007 figure. This also represents a rise of 106% on the 2004 total. An overall detection rate of 98% was attained for this group of offences in 2008. See Chapter 15.

## **16 Offences Not Elsewhere Classified**

In 2008, 3,505 *Offences Not Elsewhere Classified* were recorded. This is an increase of 17% on the number recorded in 2007. Nearly 70% of offences within this group were detected in 2008. See Chapter 16.

# *Chapter 1*

## *Homicide Offences*

There were 89 *Homicide Offences* (ICCS Group 01) recorded in 2008 representing a decrease of almost one-third (32.6%) on the 132 recorded offences in 2007. Offences in this group had increased year on year between 2004 and 2006 and then decreased every year in the time period 2006-2008, reaching the lowest level for these years in 2008.

In 2008, *Homicide Offences* had a detection rate of over 83%, with 74 offences detected. See *Figure 1.1 and Table 1.1*.

There were 55 recorded *Murder/Manslaughter/Infanticide* (ICCS 011) offences in 2008, compared to 85 in 2007. Offences of this type increased consistently from 2004 to 2007, rising over 88% in this time period and then fell by 35.3% between 2007 and 2008. There was a detection rate of 72.7% for these offences in 2008.

34 offences of *Dangerous Driving Leading to Death* (ICCS 012) offences were recorded in 2008. This is almost 28% less than the figure for 2007. A discussion of this apparent decrease is given in the technical notes section below. Recorded *Dangerous Driving Leading to Death* offences increased by 28.3% in the period 2004 to 2006, from 53 to 68, and then decreased by half, to 34, between 2006 and 2008.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 67 of the *Homicide Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings were commenced in relation to 32 offences. Convictions were returned in relation to 8 instances, while proceedings in relation to 21 were still pending. See *Table 1.2*.

Males composed three quarters of those convicted for *Homicide Offences* in 2008. See *Table 1.3*.

Comparing per capita figures for 2008, shows that Limerick Garda Division, in the Southern Region, was highest for recorded *Murder/Manslaughter/Infanticide* offences, while Laois/Offaly Garda Division was highest for *Dangerous Driving Leading to Death* offences. See *Tables 1.4a and 1.4b*.

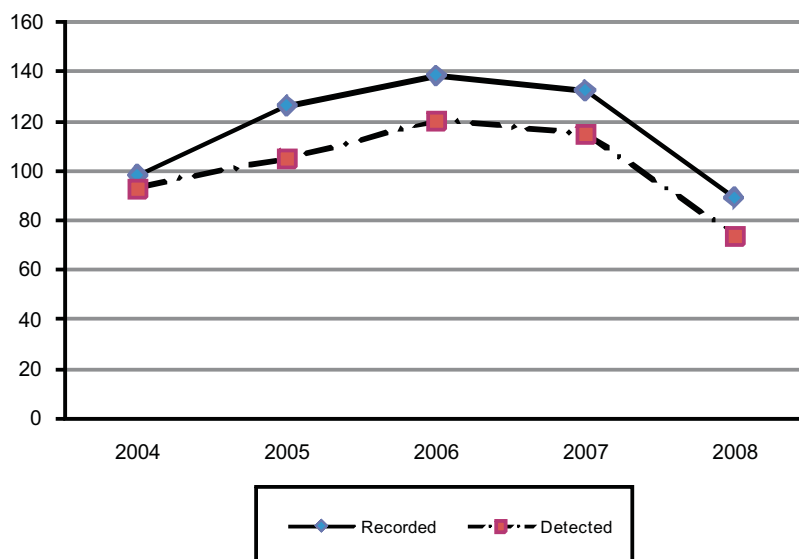
In 2008, there were 55 victims of *Murder and Manslaughter* (ICCS 0111 and 0112 respectively) offences. Of these, 45 were male, 10 were female, and 40 were Irish. Guns were involved in 21 *Murder and Manslaughter* offences, while knives were involved in 12 offences. See Table 1.5.

**Technical note**

***Dangerous Driving Leading to Death Offences (ICCS 012)***

A decrease was noted in the number of recorded *Dangerous Driving Leading to Death Offences* (ICCS 012) between 2007 and 2008, from 47 to 34. The apparent decrease in these offences is partly due to the fact that all road collision investigations for this period have not yet concluded, which may result in some offences being reclassified as Group 01 – Homicide Offences.

## *Chapter 2*

# *Sexual Offences*

There were 1,407 *Sexual Offences* (ICCS 02) recorded in 2008 representing an increase (3%) on the 1,366 recorded offences in 2007. Reported offences in this group had decreased year on year between 2004 and 2008.

In 2008, *Sexual Offences* had a detection rate of 56.5%, with 795 offences detected. See *Figure 2.1 and Table 2.1*.

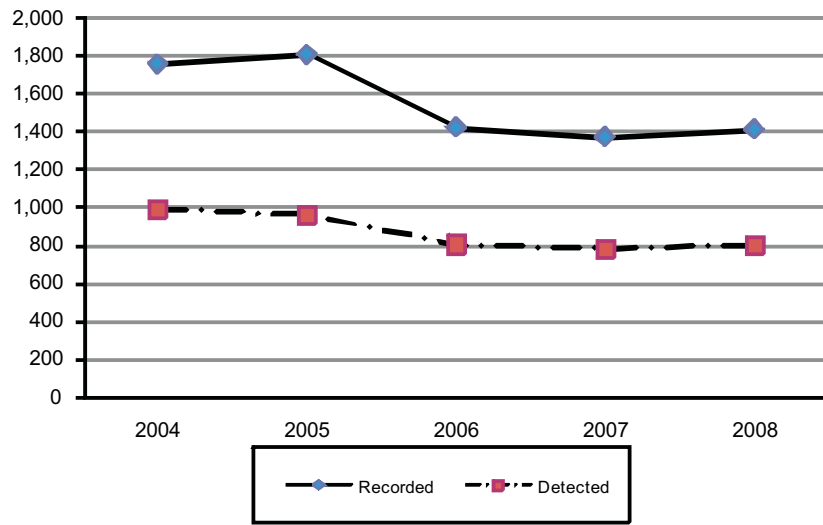
There were 891 recorded *Sexual assault (not aggravated)* (ICCS 0215) offences in 2008, compared to 809 in 2007. Offences of this type decreased consistently from 2005 to 2007, falling 30.0% in this time period. There was a detection rate of 58.6% for these offences in 2008.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 329 of the *Sexual Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings were commenced in relation to 158 offences. Convictions were returned in relation to 29 instances, while proceedings in relation to 106 are still pending. See *Table 2.2*.

No females were convicted for *Sexual Offences* in 2008. The majority (55.2%) of those convicted were males in the 25-44 age category. See *Table 2.3*.

Comparing per capita figures for 2008, shows that North Central DMR Garda Division, in the DMR Region, was highest for recorded *Rape of a male or female* offences (ICCS 0211), while Waterford Garda Division was highest for *Defilement of a boy or girl less than 17 years* (ICCS 0212) offences. South Central DMR Garda Division had the highest per capita figure for the combined total for *Sexual offence involving mentally impaired person* (ICCS 0213), *Aggravated sexual assault* (ICCS 0214) and *Sexual Assault (not aggravated)* (ICCS 0215). ## *Chapter 3*

# *Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences*

There were 19,152 *Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments or Related Offences* (ICCS 03) recorded in 2008 representing an increase of 8.4% on the 17,666 recorded offences in 2007. Reported offences in this group have increased year on year between 2004 and 2008.

In 2008, *Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences* had a detection rate of over 59%, with 11,317 offences detected. See *Figure. 3.1 and Table 3.1*.

There were 201 recorded *Murder-threat* (ICCS 0312) offences in 2008, compared to 161 in 2007. Recorded offences of *Minor Assault* (ICCS 0324) increased by 10.0% between 2007 (10,995 offences) and 2008 (12,105). In relation to *Harassment, stalking, threats* offences (ICCS 0331), there were 788 recorded offences, an increase of over 31% on 2007.

Relevant proceedings were taken in relation to 5,061 of the *Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings were commenced in relation to 3,433 offences. Convictions were returned in relation to 1,025 instances, while proceedings in relation to 738 were still pending. See *Table 3.2*.

Considering the age and gender breakdown of those convicted for *Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences* in 2008, 79 were committed by males under the age of 18 while 12 were committed by females under the age of 18. The age group, for males, with the most convictions was the 18-24 category, while for females, the age group with most convictions was the 25-44 one. The vast majority of convictions (1,014) were for *Assault* (ICCS 032). See *Table 3.3*.

Comparing per capita figures for 2008, shows that Limerick Garda Division, was highest for recorded *Murder- Threat* offences (ICCS 0312), while North Central DMR Division was highest for *Assault Causing Harm and Poisoning* Offences (ICCS 0321,0322). Donegal Garda Division and Mayo Garda Division have the highest and second highest per-capita figures for *Harassment and Related Offences* (ICCS 033). See *Tables 3.4a, 3.4c and 3.4e*

**Figure 3.1: Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences, recorded and detected, 2004-2008**

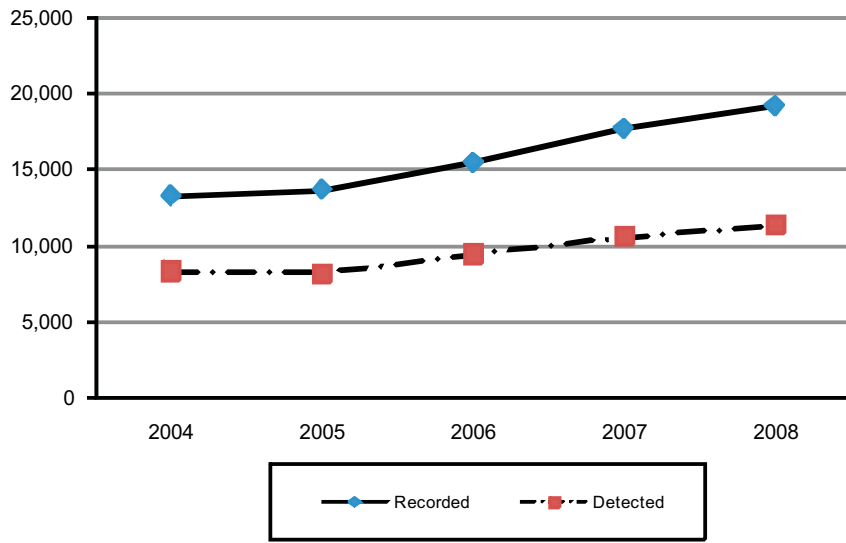

## *Chapter 4*

# *Dangerous or Negligent Acts*

There were 238,300 *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* Offences (ICCS 04) recorded in 2008 representing a decrease (6.7%) on 2007. There had been an increase in these offences in the period 2005-2007. The great majority of these offences are *Dangerous or Negligent Operation of a Vehicle Offences* (ICCS 041). In 2008, *Dangerous or Negligent Acts Offences* had a detection rate of over 99%. See *Figure 4.1 and Table 4.1*.

There were 174,200 recorded *Speeding* (ICCS 0415) offences in 2008, compared to 192,320 in 2007. In 2008, there were 44,513 recorded *Dangerous/careless driving and motorway offences* (ICCS 0414), an increase of 2,306 on 2007. Over the same period, *Driving/In charge of a vehicle while over legal alcohol limit* offences (ICCS 0414) decreased by almost 10% to 17,940. *Abandoning a child, child neglect and cruelty* offences (ICCS 0422) decreased by 3.4% between 2007 and 2008.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 57,820 of the *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* Offences recorded in 2008. Court proceedings were commenced in relation to 46,989 offences. Convictions were returned in relation to 18,049 instances, while non-convictions were returned in relation to 26,835. See *Table 4.2*.

Of those convicted for offences recorded in 2008, over 48% were in the 25-44 age category. See *Table 4.3*.

The Eastern Garda Region had the highest per-capita rates for *Dangerous/careless driving and motorway offences*, with 1,194 offences per 100,000 population. See *Table 4.4d*.

### **Technical Note**

#### ***Dangerous or Negligent Acts offences (ICCS Group 04)***

The data on road-related offences in Group 04 incorporates administrative data provided by An Garda Síochána's FCPS (Fixed Charge Penalty System) data, in addition to PULSE data. The number of offence types included on the FCPS system was extended in April, 2006.

**Figure 4.1: *Dangerous or Negligent Acts*, recorded and detected, 2004-2008**

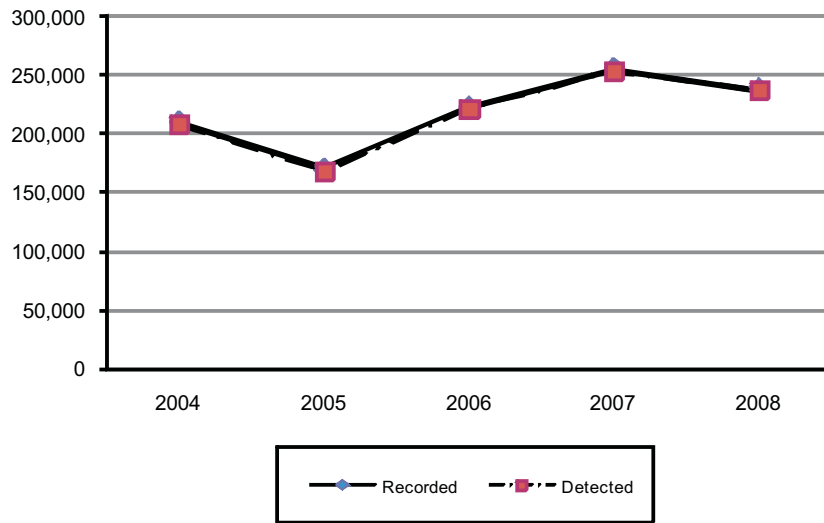

## *Chapter 5*

# *Kidnapping and Related Offences*

There were 77 recorded offences in *Kidnapping and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 05) in 2008, a decrease of over a quarter (27.4%) on the number recorded in 2007. It is important also to note that a new offence type *Human trafficking offences* (ICCS 0513) was added to this group in 2008, which will affect the overall total. Between 2004 and 2005 there was no change in the number of offences recorded in this group. Between 2005 and 2007, the number recorded rose by just over 43%, from 74 to 106.

In 2008, there was a 57.1% detection rate for this group. *False imprisonment* (ICCS 0511) offences had a detection rate of over 72% (34 of 47 offences recorded).

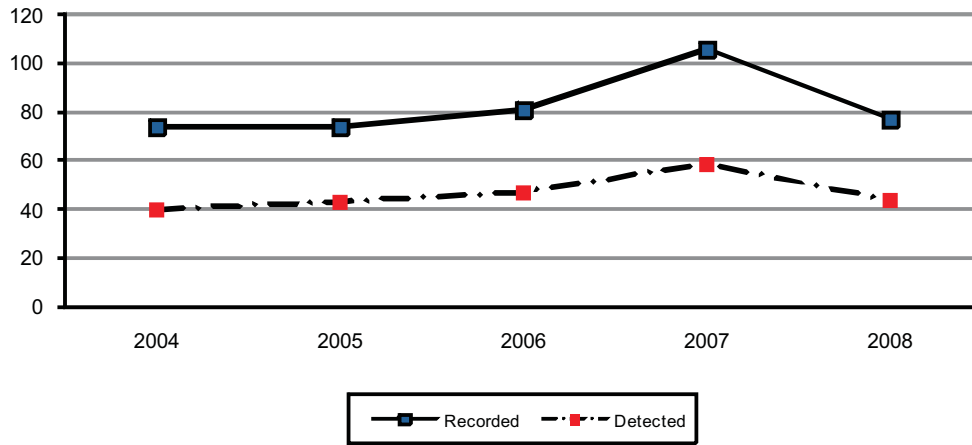
Of the 77 offences recorded in 2008, 47 were *False imprisonment*, 23 were *Abduction of person under 16 years of age* (ICCS 0512), the remainder being *Human trafficking offences*. See *Table 5.1*.

There were 18 recorded *Kidnapping and False Imprisonment offences* where relevant proceedings were taken. Court proceedings were commenced in relation to 13 of these offences. Convictions were achieved in relation to 4 offences recorded in 2008, while court proceedings in relation to 7 offences were still pending. See *Table 5.2*.

All those convicted of offences in this group were male, in the 18-44 age bracket. See *Table 5.3*.

Also included are detailed figures for the number of recorded offences, detections and offences leading to further relevant proceedings at Garda division level and regional level for selected offence types within this group. See *Table 5.4a*.

## *Chapter 6*

# *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences*

There were 2,299 *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* recorded in 2008. This was a slight increase on 2007 but is 15.4% lower than in 2004, when 2,717 crimes in this group were recorded. There were 869 *Robbery of an establishment or institution* (ICCS 0611) offences recorded in 2008. This was an increase of 55 (6.8%) on the figure in 2007.

There was little change in the number of recorded *Robbery from the person* (ICCS 0613) offences in 2008 compared with 2007 but the number recorded was 214 (14.5%) lower than in 2004. *Robbery of cash or goods in transit* (ICCS 0612) offences dropped overall between 2004 and 2008, from 61 to 26. *Hijacking Offences* (ICCS 063) increased by 55 (90.2%) between 2007 and 2008, from 61 to 116. See *Table 6.1 and Figure 6.1*.

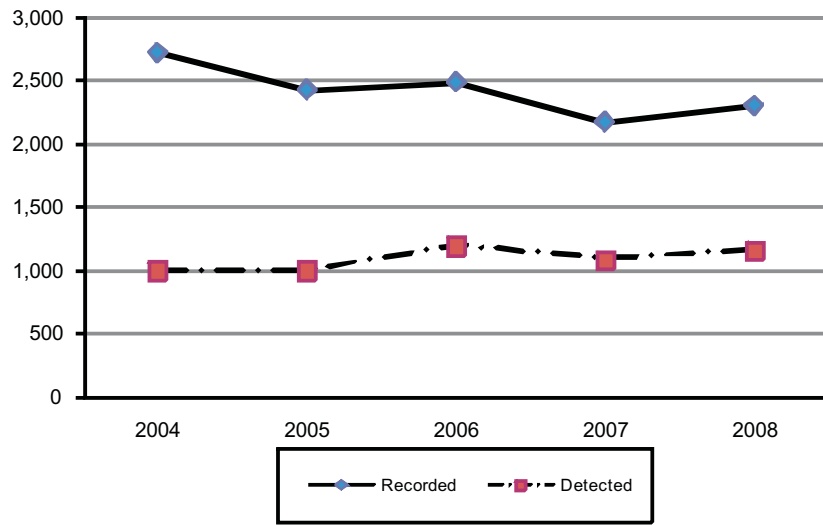
In 2008, just over 50% of offences in this group were detected. See *Table 6.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 726 or over 31% of *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings were commenced in relation to 555 offences. Of these, 191 led to convictions, and 253 were pending. See *Table 6.2*.

Over 96% of persons convicted for offences within this group were male. Almost half of these were aged 25-44, while 29 were aged under 18. See *Table 6.3*.

Detailed figures for 2008 show that Dublin Metropolitan Region had the highest number of offences recorded per capita for this group. See *Table 6.4*.

## *Chapter 7*

# *Burglary and Related Offences*

There were 24,684 *Burglary and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 07) recorded in 2008. This is an increase of nearly 5% on the same figure from one year previous. *Burglary (not aggravated)* (ICCS 0712) follows a similar pattern to the group total, increasing by 3.8% in this time period. *Aggravated burglary* (ICCS 0711) rose by 70 or 27.5% since 2007 from 255 to 325. *Possession of an article (with intent to burgle, steal, demand)* (ICCS 0713) offences recorded rose from 296 in 2007 to 424 in 2008, an increase of over 43%. See *Table 7.1*.

Detection rates for this group increased year on year since 2004, from 17.0% to 26.3% in 2008. *Possession of an article (with intent to burgle, steal, demand)* had the highest detection rate in 2008 at 99.8%. This is to be expected due to the nature of the crime type. *Burglary (not aggravated)* (ICCS 0712) had the lowest detection rate with nearly one quarter (24.6%) of offences being detected. See *Table 7.1*.

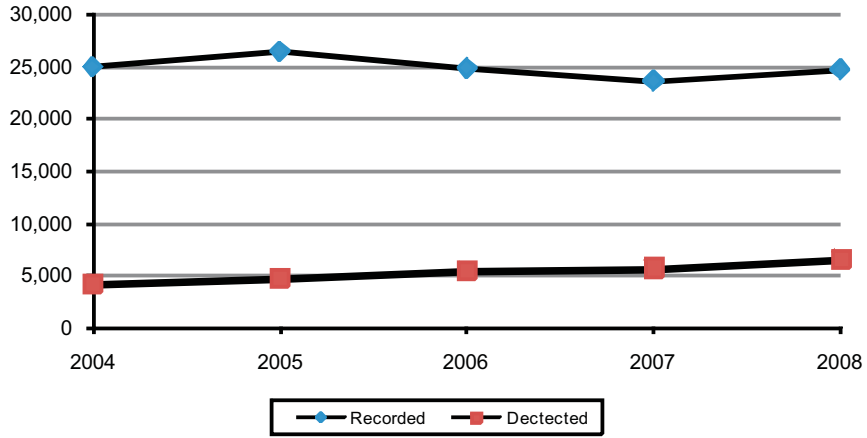
Relevant court proceedings commenced for 3,256 (13.2%), *Burglary and Related Offences* recorded in 2008. More than half (57.0%) of these resulted in a conviction, 16.9% received non-convictions while 26.1% of cases were still pending (including appeals allowed). See *Tables 7.1 and 7.2*.

Over 93% of persons convicted within this group were for *Burglary (not aggravated)*. This is to be anticipated due to the high volume of records of this crime type. Just over 96% of persons convicted of *Burglary and Related Offences* were male. Of these 42.6% were aged 18-24, while 44.6% were aged 25-44. See *Table 7.3*.

The majority of *Burglary and Related Offences* were recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Region. South Central DMR had the highest rate per 100,000 population for all offence types within this group in 2008. See *Tables 7.4a, 7.4b and 7.4c*.

Firearms were involved in 50 *Aggravated burglary* offences in 2008. This is an increase of 51.5% on the same figure in 2007. Nearly half (48.0%) of aggravated burglaries of this nature were carried out in the Dublin Metropolitan Region. Knives were involved in 131 aggravated burglaries in 2008, representing an increase of 44.0% on the 2007 figure. See *Table 7.5*.

## Chapter 8

# *Theft and Related Offences*

There were 76,863 recorded *Theft and Related Offences* in 2008, an increase of 2.2% on the 2007 total of 75,190. The total number of recorded offences in this group has not varied much since 2004, when there were 72,201 recorded offences. See *Table 8.1 and Figure 8.1*.

In 2008, the number of recorded *Theft/Unauthorised taking of vehicle* (ICCS 0811) offences was 12,217; there were 3,286 recorded *Theft from person* (ICCS 0821) offences; and 20,098 *Theft from shop* (ICCS 0822) offences.

Compared with 2007, *Theft from person offences* (ICCS 0821) increased by 11.7% in 2008. However, when compared with 2004, these offences have decreased by 42.5%. See *Table 8.1*.

The overall detection rate for *Theft and Related Offences* was 30.7% in 2008, with 23,631 offences detected. Detection rates varied for offences within the group. *Handling or possession of stolen property* (ICCS 0831) had a detection rate of 99.9%, followed by *Theft from shop* (ICCS 0822) at 61.8%. *Theft/Unauthorised taking of a pedal cycle* (ICCS 0824) had the lowest detection rate within the group at just over 6%. See *Table 8.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 16,020 of the *Theft and Related Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings commenced for 13,948 offences. Convictions were returned for 6,881 of these, outcomes were still pending for 3,536 offences. See *Table 8.2*.

Nearly three-quarters of those convicted of *Theft and Related Offences* recorded in 2008 were male. More than half of all convicted were aged 25-44. See *Table 8.3*.

Figures at regional and divisional level show that the Dublin Metropolitan Region had the highest per capita rate for all crime types within this group. See *Tables 8.4a, 8.4b and 8.4c*.

**Figure 8.1: Theft and Related Offences, recorded and detected, 2004-2008**

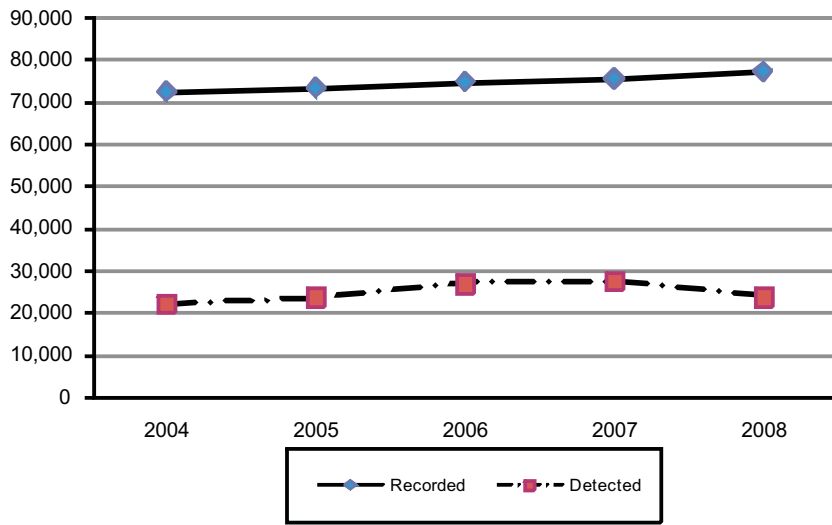

## *Chapter 9*

# *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences*

There were 5,411 recorded *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* (ICCS Group 09) in 2008. This is a decrease of 7.7% on the 2007 figure of 5,860. The fall can be attributed primarily to decreases in the largest categories in this group: *Fraud, deception, false pretence offences* (ICCS 0911) and *Forging an instrument to defraud* (ICCS 0912) offences. They fell by 18.7% and 3.7% respectively between 2007 and 2008. See *Table 9.1 and Figure 9.1*.

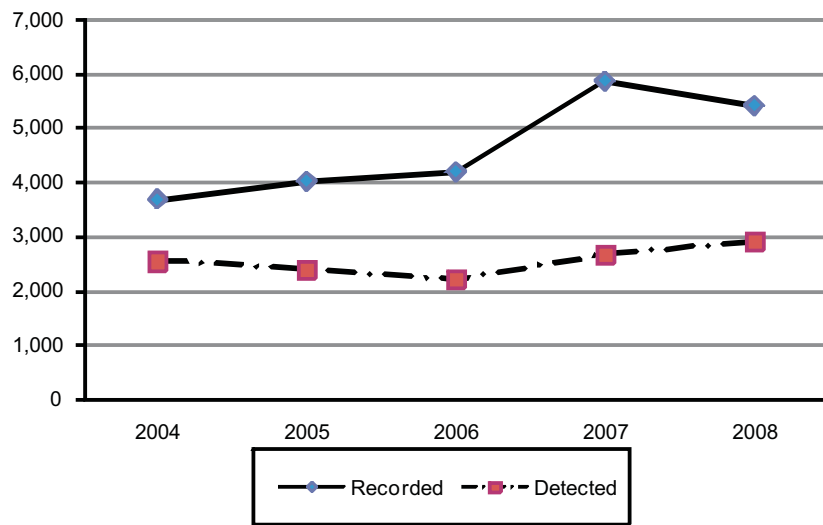
The detection rates for *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* rose from 45.0% in 2007 to 53.3% in 2008. See *Table 9.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 1,564 *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings commenced in relation to 1,365 of these offences. Convictions were secured for 621 offences, non-convictions for 419 offences, while 325 offences were still pending. See *Table 9.2*.

Males constituted just over 82% of all persons convicted, while 60% of persons convicted were aged 25-44. See *Table 9.3*.

The highest per capita incidence of *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* was in North Central DMR Garda division with 476 offences per 100,000 population. See *Table 9.4*.

## *Chapter 10*

# *Controlled Drug Offences*

There were 23,405 recorded *Controlled Drug Offences* (ICCS 10) in 2008. The number of drug offences has increased in each year since 2004, when 9,868 offences were recorded. The number of recorded offences of *Possession of drugs for personal use* (ICCS 1022) more than doubled over the same period from 7,138 to 18,093. See *Table 10.1 and Figure 10.1*.

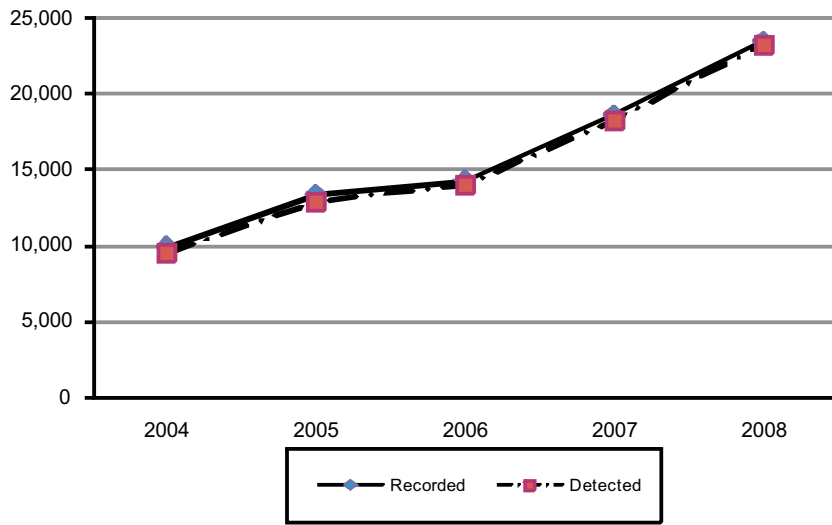
The overall detection rate for this group in 2008 was 99.0% . Drug offences have high detection rates due to the fact that a suspected offender is generally present when the incident becomes known to the Gardaí. See *Table 10.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 14,349 *Controlled Drug Offences* recorded in 2008, with court proceedings commencing for 9,481 offences. Convictions were secured in 3,441 instances, while 1,251 offences were still pending. See *Table 10.2*.

Males aged 18-44 years old represented almost 90% of all those convicted for *Controlled Drug Offences* recorded in 2007. See *Table 10.3*.

Comparing per capita figures for 2007 shows that the Dublin Metropolitan Region had the highest number of recorded offences for *Controlled Drug Offences*. See *Table 10.4*.

# Chapter 11

## *Weapons and Explosives Offences*

In 2008, there were 4,016 recorded *Weapons and Explosives Offences* (ICCS Group 11), an increase of 11.7% of the 2007 figure of 3,595. Recorded *Weapons and Explosives Offences* increased each year since 2004, when 2,154 offences were recorded. The largest category contributing to this increase was *Offensive Weapons Offences (NEC)* (ICCS 113). This covers non-firearm weapons offences. There were 1,424 of these offences recorded in 2004, rising consistently each year to 2,979 in 2008. See *Table 11.1 and Figure 11.1*.

The detection rate for *Weapons and Explosives Offences* recorded in 2008 was over 90%, with 3,648 offences detected. See *Table 11.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 2,042 *Weapons and Explosives Offences* recorded in 2008. Court proceedings commenced in relation to 1,685 of these offences. Convictions were secured in 761 instances, while court outcomes in relation to 393 were still pending. See *Table 11.2*.

Nearly 96% of all persons convicted were male. See *Table 11.3*.

Western DMR Division had the highest per capita rate for *Firearms Offences* (ICCS 112) with 41.4 recorded offences per 100,000 population. Dublin North Central DMR Division had the highest instance of recorded *Offensive Weapons Offences (NEC)* (ICCS 113). See *Table 11.4b and 11.4c*.

### **Technical Note**

#### ***Fireworks Offences (ICCS 114)***

In mid-2006, the separate recording of *Fireworks Offences* (ICCS 114) was introduced, prior to then, these would be included in *Explosives and Chemical Weapons Offences* (ICCS 111).

Figure 11.1: Weapons and Explosives Offences, recorded and detected, 2004-2008

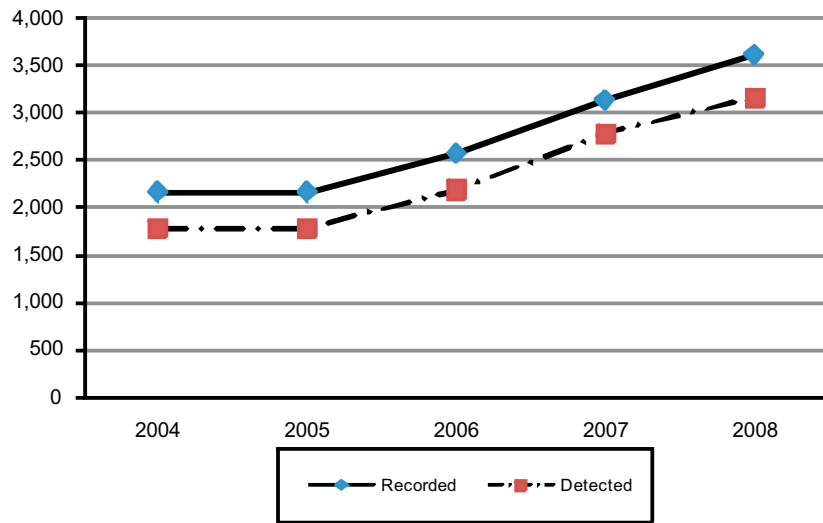

## *Chapter 12*

# *Damage to Property and to the Environment*

There were 44,626 recorded *Damage to Property and to the Environment* (ICCS Group 12) offences in 2008. This is 3.1% more than the number recorded in 2007. Offences in this group increased by over one-fifth (20.5%) in the period 2004 - 2008. The vast majority of these offences, throughout this time period, were *Criminal damage (not arson)* (ICCS 1212), which accounted for 42,193 of the offences recorded in 2008. See *Table 12.1*.

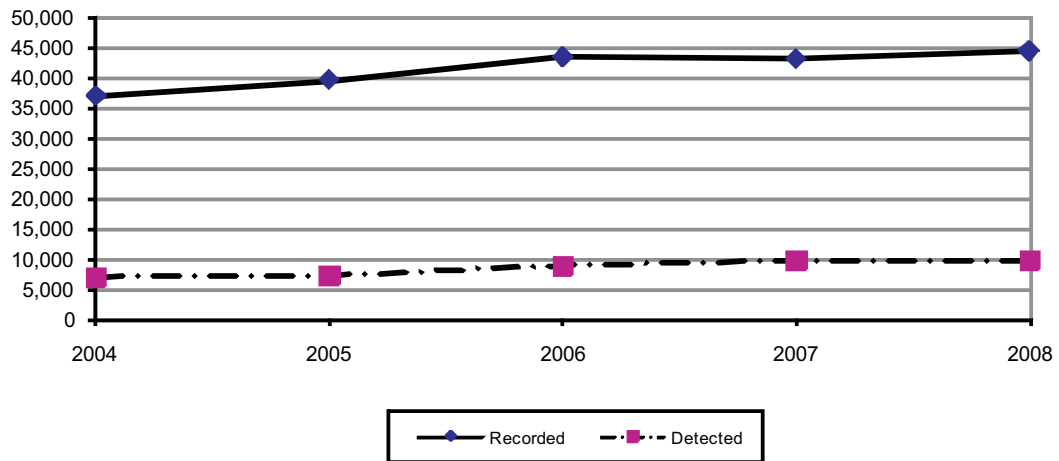
*Arson* (ICCS 1211) offences increased by 7.9% between 2007 (1,998) and 2008 (2,155). Slightly more than 20% of these offences were detected in 2008.

There were 4,404 *Damage to Property and to the Environment* offences recorded in 2008 where relevant proceedings were taken. Court proceedings began in relation to 3,664 of these offences, with over 95% of these relating to *Criminal damage (not arson)*. Convictions were achieved in relation to 1,569 offences recorded in 2008, while court proceedings in relation to 760 offences were still pending. See *Table 12.2*.

Of the 1,659 convicted in relation to offences recorded in 2008, 1,560 were male. Of these, 956 (61.3%) were under 25 years of age. See *Table 12.3*.

When looking at figures at Garda Division and Regional Level, in 2008, Limerick was the Garda Division with the highest absolute number of recorded *Arson* offences (285) and also the highest (142.5) per 100,000 population. North Central DMR was the division with the highest per-population rate in 2008 for *Criminal damage (not arson)* offences, with 2600.9 offences per 100,000 population. See *Tables 12.4a and 12.4b*.

# *Chapter 13*

## *Public Order and Other Social Code Offences*

In 2008, there were 61,822 recorded *Public Order and other Social Code Offences* (ICCS Group 13), compared to 60,586 recorded offences in 2007. Offences in this group have increased consistently in the period 2004-2008, rising by almost 30%. In 2008, over 93% of these offences were detected.

The majority of offences for this group fall under *Disorderly Conduct* (ICCS 131). In 2008, these accounted for 53,421 of the 61,822 offences recorded.

Among the other sub-groups, *Trespass Offences* (ICCS 132) increased by 134.8% in the period 2004-2008, to 3,675, and *Regulated Betting/Money, Collection/Trading Offences* (ICCS 135) increased from 317 to 415 in the same period. *Liquor Licensing Offences* (ICCS 133) decreased by over 42% between 2004 and 2008 even though 3 new offence types were added to this group in 2008. See *Table 13.1 and Figure 13.1*.

In 2008, there were 29,534 *Public Order and Other Social Code Offences* recorded where relevant proceedings were commenced. Of these, 22,779 related to *Public order offences* (ICCS 1312), while 4,115 related to *Drunkenness offences* (ICCS 1313). Court proceedings began in relation to 25,216 Group 13 offences. Convictions were obtained in relation to 14,684 offences recorded in 2008, while court proceedings in relation to 3,203 offences were still pending. See *Table 13.2*.

Of the 14,135 convictions for *Disorderly Conduct* relating to offences recorded in 2008, over 90% were male. Of these 12,839 male persons, 86.5% were between the ages of 18 and 44. See *Table 13.3*.

In 2008, North Central DMR was the Garda Division with the highest per-population rate for *Disorderly Conduct* offences (4,193 per 100,000 population).

**Figure 13.1: Public Order and other Social Code Offences recorded and detected, 2004-2008**

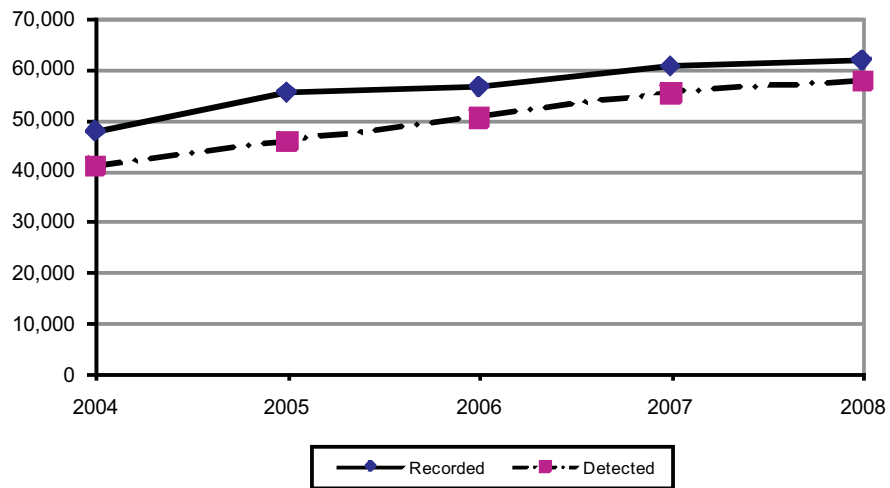

## *Chapter 14*

# *Road and Traffic Offences (NEC)*

There were 332,372 *Road and Traffic Offences (NEC)* (ICCS Group 14) recorded by An Garda Síochána in 2008. This represents increases of 5.1% and 78.8% on the 2007 and 2004 figures respectively. *Driving Licence/Insurance Offences* (ICCS 141) decreased by 4.6% on 2007 going from 36,389 in 2007 to 34,700 in 2008. Within this subgroup *Driving licence-failure to have, produce, etc.* (ICCS 1411) decreased by 5.5% on 2007 while increasing four-fold in the period 2004-2008 from 1,536 to 7,720. *Road Transport/Public Service Vehicles Offences* (ICCS 144) also increased over four-fold since 2004 and by 90.1% since 2007. *Roadworthiness/Regulatory Offences* (ICCS 143) had an overall growth of 96.3% from 2004 to 2008. See *Table 14.1*.

Detection rates for this group are very high with 99.2% of all *Road and Traffic Offences (NEC)* in 2008 being detected. *Obstruction under Road Traffic Acts* (ICCS 1432) had the lowest rate at 57.8%. See *Table 14.1*.

Relevant court proceedings commenced for 113,911 (34.3%) of all *Road and Traffic Offences (NEC)* recorded in 2008. Convictions were obtained in relation to 31,812 (9.6%) offences recorded in 2008, while court proceedings in relation to 2,062 offences were still pending. *Driving Licence/Insurance Offences* is the subgroup with the highest conviction rate, in relation to recorded offences, at 15.9%. See *Table 14.2*.

Of the persons convicted of *Road and Traffic Offences (NEC)* recorded in 2008, almost 60 % were for *Roadworthiness/Regulatory Offences*. Males constituted 85.3% of all persons convicted of offences in this group, with 72.6% of them aged from 18 to 44. See *Table 14.3*.

Comparing offences recorded per capita for 2008, North Central DMR Garda Division had the highest rate for all subgroups within this group. See *Tables 14.4a, 14.4b, 14.4c and 14.4d*.

### **Technical Note**

This section includes data from An Garda Síochána's Fixed Charge Penalty System (FCPS). This data is not recorded on the PULSE system but is included here for presentational purposes.

# *Chapter 15*

## *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime*

The number of *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime* (ICCS Group 15) increased by over one-fifth (20.8%) between 2007 and 2008. This rise is primarily attributed to the increase in *Breach of Justice/Court Orders* (ICCS 155) offences over this period, from 10,104 to 11,591. There was also a dramatic increase in *Offences while in Custody and Related offences* (ICCS 154). See the Technical Note below for an explanation. The number of offences in this group has increased by 106.0% since 2004. See *Table 15.1*.

Detection rates are high within this group with an average detection rate of 98.2% in 2008. This rate has remained relatively constant since 2004. See *Table 15.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 6,200 (46.7%) of the incidents recorded in 2008. Of the 5,535 offences where court proceedings commenced, convictions were obtained in 51.7% of these cases while 1,265 (22.9%) were still pending. See *Table 15.2*.

68.4% of persons convicted within this group were for *Breach of bail* (ICCS 1552) offences and males represent 86.1% of those convicted of this crime type. Overall males accounted for nearly 87.2% of all persons convicted within this group. Over half (52.5%) of persons convicted were aged 25-44 with 35.6% aged 18-24. See *Table 15.3*.

Regional and divisional breakdowns show that in 2008, North Central DMR had the highest rate of incidents per 100,000 population for *Offences while in Custody, Breach of Justice/Court Orders*, while Limerick had the highest per capita for *Offences against Government and its agents* (ICCS 151). See *Tables 15.4a and 15.4d*.

### **Technical Note**

#### ***Prison offences (ICCS 1542)***

Section 36 of the Prisons Act 2007, which was brought into operation from 1 May, 2007 makes it an offence for prisoners to have unauthorised possession of or use of mobile telecommunication devices.

**Figure 15.1: Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime recorded and detected, 2004-2008**

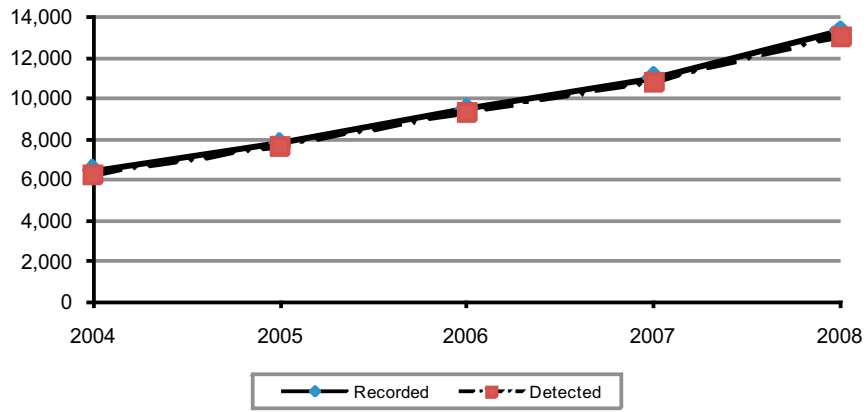

## *Chapter 16*

# *Offences Not Elsewhere Classified*

In 2008, there were 3,505 offences recorded under *Offences Not Elsewhere Classified* (ICCS Group 16), an increase of 17.0% on the previous year's total of 2,996. The majority of these are categorised under *Immigration offences/carrier liability* (ICCS 1648) which increased from 1,419 in 2007 to 1,669 in 2008. *Importation/Control/Welfare of Animal Offences* (ICCS 161) recorded an increase of 150.2% on the same figure in 2004. *Dog ownership offences (licence, control etc)* (ICCS 1613) increased by 208.5% over the same period from 317 to 978. See *Table 16.1*.

Detection rates vary greatly within this group for 2008. For example, *Employment permit offences (relating to non-Irish national)* (ICCS 1647) had 94.1% detection rates while *Control of horses offences* (ICCS 1612) had a detection rate of 27.5%. See *Table 16.1*.

Relevant proceedings were taken for 1,112 (31.7%) *Offences Not Elsewhere Classified* recorded in 2008, with the majority (710) of these for *Immigration offences/carrier liability*. Convictions were secured for 260 *Immigration offences/carrier liability* offences recorded in 2008, while 135 were still pending. See *Table 16.2*.

The majority of persons convicted of offences within this group recorded in 2008 were for *Immigration offences/carrier liability* with over half (54.4%) of these being male aged 25-44. Over 53% of females convicted of this offence were aged 25-44 with 34.5% aged 18-24. Males represented 91.7% of those convicted for *Importation/Control/Welfare of Animals Offences* (ICCS 161). See *Table 16.3*.

Donegal recorded the highest rate per capita of *Importation/Control/Welfare of Animal Offences*, Cork West had the highest rate for *Fisheries/Maritime Offences* (ICCS 162), Laois/Offaly had the highest rate for *Use of Data, Electronic Counterfeit and Broadcasting* (ICCS 163) while Louth had the highest for *Miscellaneous Offences* (ICCS 164). See *Tables 16.4a, 16.4b, 16.4c and 16.4d*.

**Figure 16.1: Offences Not Elsewhere Classified recorded and detected, 2004-2008**

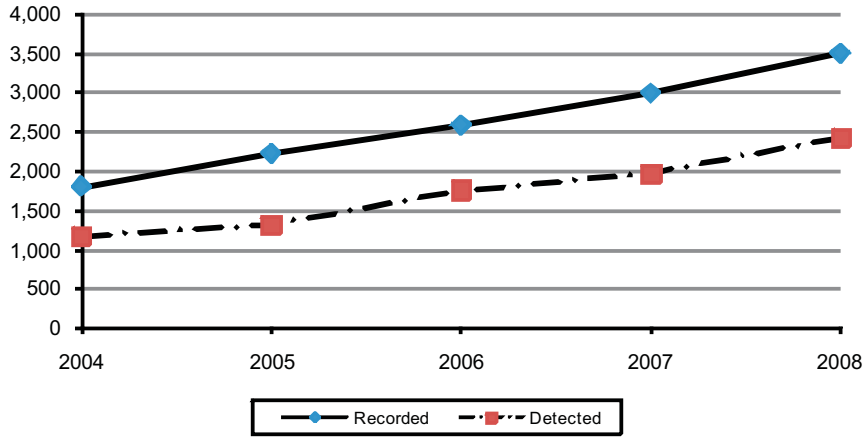

# *Background Information*

## **Classification of Offences**

A criminal offence is classified at the time it is entered on the PULSE system. In the vast majority of cases, this happens very soon after the crime incident becomes known to a member of An Garda Síochána.

However, many recorded crimes are followed by investigation, during which more information becomes available. This may result in offences being reclassified from one type of crime to another. Indeed, a record can also be marked as invalid (but not deleted) if it transpires that a criminal offence did not occur. Conversely, an incident, not initially thought to be criminal in nature, can subsequently be reclassified as a criminal incident on foot of further information.

### *Court outcomes - Homicide*

In general, offences are not reclassified on PULSE on foot of a court outcome. An exception to this rule involves offences classified under *Homicide Offences* (ICCS Group 01). It can often be the case that a charge of murder is brought and a verdict of manslaughter is returned. In such a case, the original offence is reclassified to reflect the court outcome. (It is for this reason that Murder/Manslaughter offences should be treated together in any trend analysis.)

### *Assaults – resulting in death*

An assault is generally recorded as such close to the time of the assault incident. However, if the victim subsequently dies as a consequence, and after the assault has been recorded, this will always result in reclassification to a homicide offence on PULSE.

## Recording Offences - Counting Rules

Crime counting rules are a complex area and have been the subject of debate over the years. However, from an information/statistical perspective, crime counting rules should be applied in accordance with established criteria.

To fully appreciate the complexity involved, it is useful to consider a criminal event which consists of more than one offence. For instance, a burglary and an assault offence can occur within one event. Furthermore, there could be offences of trespass, criminal damage and arson also occurring as part of the same event. For this event, the homicide would be recorded, as well as some other offences. It would be unreasonable to suppose that all offences should be recorded (especially if there was more than one victim, see below), as some would be considered to be trivial in the context of the homicide. So in this case, for practical purposes and on reasonable grounds, not all offences would be recorded. The question then is what is recorded and how does this give comparable data?

There are a number of key counting rules that are applied to the recording of offences. They are the *Primary Offence* and the *One Offence Counts Per Victim* rules.

### *Primary Offence Rule*

- This particular counting rule dictates that when an incident results in a number of offences, only the most serious offence is counted for statistical purposes.

This is achieved by flagging, within PULSE, one offence which should “count” for that event. This practice promotes consistency. Counting only the primary incident is thus a good way of ensuring that there is consistent treatment of criminal events – and consistency is paramount when it comes to comparison of data across geographic boundaries or over time. Without the primary offence rule, there would be no basis to compare these data over any boundaries - be they geographic or time-based.

The offence with the severest potential penalty is generally flagged as the primary offence. However, offences against the person take precedence over offences against property when the offences have similar penalties.

### *One Offence Counts Per Victim*

- A. In general, one offence is counted per victim for any crime incident (i.e. criminal event). So, irrespective of the number of offenders it is the number of victims of an incident that dictate how many offences will be recorded.

For example, a sexual event with one offender and two victims counts as two offences. Conversely, an event with two offenders and one victim counts as one offence (or crime incident) in the recorded crime statistics. In this latter case it is useful to remember that this one crime incident is the one that counts, regardless of how many offenders are prosecuted or subsequently convicted.

There are two exceptions to the *one offence counts per victim* rule.

- *Financial losses sustained by institutions due to fraud*

A first exception to the rule is a series of incidents involving credit/debit card/cheque card fraud. The critical issue in determining the number of offences recorded is who bears the financial loss of the incidents. If the financial loss is ultimately sustained by an institution (for instance a bank), a single offence is recorded because it is akin to a series of incidents against one victim (see note on repeat incidents below). However, if the financial loss is incurred by a number of individuals then normal rules apply and one offence does count per victim.

- *Burglary*

The second exception is that of burglary, where there may be more than one victim (in the normal sense of the word). This occurs when, for instance, items belonging to more than one person are taken. Counting one offence per individual (person) victim would affect comparability. This is because the number of burglaries recorded would become a function of the number of people living in burgled households. This is an interesting quantity from a victimisation perspective, but not from a crime counting perspective. Therefore, the *one offence per victim* rule is not applied in the case of burglary, and a single offence is generally recorded. It is useful to think of the burglary as being a crime against a household for statistical reasons.

B. An extension of the *One Offence Counts Per Victim* rule applies for repeat incidents involving the same victim and the same offender.

Again, it is useful to look at sexual offences to illustrate this point. It may be the case that there are numerous crime incidents perpetrated by the same offender against the same victim stretching back for many years (and often reported many years after the last incident). It would be unreasonable to expect the same level of detail to be recorded about every individual offence that occurred throughout the series. Moreover, some victims may not, for a variety of reasons, be in a position to remember all of the incidents involved in the series. Therefore, applying the rule of one incident counts per victim for a series like this promotes consistency in approach for comparative purposes. That is not to say that more information cannot be provided on the numbers of such incidents. It can. It is simply a case of interpretation being subject to some extra caveats. (For this type of incident series, it is open to debate whether the clustered nature of the offences (in time and/or place) renders them outside the scope of normal statistical comparison.)

Data from the Fixed Charge Penalty System (FCPS) is a large component of *Dangerous or Negligent Operation of a Vehicle* (ICCS 041) and *Road and Traffic Offences* (ICCS Group 14). There are no counting rules applied to these offences.

## Issues around 'Detection' Status

Detailed guidelines exist within An Garda Síochana regarding whether a crime incident may be flagged as "detected". Within the PULSE system, however, the flagging of an incident is largely independent of any other data in the system – there is no action that is automatically triggered because of the entry made for detection status. It is therefore possible that an offence, which has in fact been detected, may, through omission, not be flagged as detected within the system.

However, the situation is less clear with regard to incidents which consist of more than one criminal offence and are recorded as such. This can also be the case when different events are grouped together on the system as an "investigation case". In these situations, it is not always clear from the raw data which offences are to be considered as detected and which are not. Therefore, this complication arises because of the sophistication of PULSE as used as an operational policing tool – which is its main purpose.

As stated above, information on offences detected is presented on an "as-was" basis according to their status as at October, 2009. However, the information is subject to an additional caveat – it may not always be the case that it is the primary offence within an incident (the one that "counts") that has in fact been detected. This feature of the data is known to An Garda Síochana and is receiving attention.

It may be intuitive to think of an offence occurring and being subsequently reported to the Gardaí – in turn this leads to the recording of the offence which triggers an investigation. The offence will, at any future point, be regarded as either detected or not detected. However, the recording sequence for some incident types does not follow this path. For these incident types, the recording of an offence actually follows the "detection" of the offence. This is true for, inter alia, some drug offences and for offences of speeding and drink-driving. The recording of these offence types is generally a function of police activities and prioritisation of those activities.
