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NOTE.

It has been considered desirable (as in 1871, 1881, and 1891) that those of the public who might not require, or be disposed to purchase, the Census Abstracts and Reports in their completeness should have access at a small cost to the statistics of the Territorial Division in which they may have a more immediate interest; and as, in Ireland, the County appears to be the most convenient and familiar area for which the principal particulars should be afforded in abstract, the Census Commissioners, with the approval of His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, present the following Tables for the City (or County Borough) of Belfast.

CITY OF BELFAST.

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CITY, OR COUNTY BOROUGH, OF BELFAST.

In addition to the information contained in the County Tables, it has been deemed advisable to adopt the course pursued in 1881 and 1891, and give the following Summary of the results obtained respecting the City, or County Borough, of Belfast, from the Census Returns of 1901.

SUMMARY.

The City, or County Borough, of Belfast covers an area of 16,504 statute acres, or 0·1 per cent. of the total area of the country.

The number of persons in the City of Belfast according to the Census was—in 1891, 273,184; and according to the recent Census, 349,180 (161,616 Males and 187,564 Females), or 27·8 per cent. more than in 1891. Population. (Table ii.)

The number of distinct Families in the City at the time of the late enumeration was 69,981, the average number of persons in a family being thus 4·9; and the number of Inhabited Houses was 67,108, showing an average of 5·1 persons to each house. In calculating these averages, the Special Inmates of Public Institutions have been omitted. Families and Houses. (Table viii.)

The number of Occupiers (or Heads of Families) in occupation of less than five rooms in 1901 was 32,008, or 45·7 per cent. of the total number of families in the City, and of these 697, or 1·0 per cent., were occupiers of one room; 4,874, or 7·0 per cent., occupiers of two rooms; 5,086, or 7·2 per cent., occupiers of three rooms; and 21,351, or 30·5 per cent., occupiers of four rooms. Occupiers of less than 5 rooms. (Tables ix. & x.)

The number of Tenements of One Room in the City was 697, comprising 307 cases in which the room had only one occupant; 330 where the room had 2, 3, or 4 occupants; and 60 cases in which there were 5, 6, or 7 occupants.

Of the persons enumerated in the City in 1901, 76·72 per cent. were born in Antrim or Down County or Belfast City; 12·57 per cent. in other Counties of the Province of Ulster; 1·99 per cent. in Leinster; 0·69 per cent. in Munster; 0·56 per cent. in Connaught; 6·64 per cent. in Great Britain; 0·83 per cent. were born abroad; and 21 persons were born at sea. Birthplaces of the inhabitants. (Table xxv.)

Religious Professions. (Table xxix.)

From the above Table it will be seen that of the total population of the City in 1901, 24·3 per cent. were Roman Catholics, 29·5 per cent. Protestant Episcopalians, 34·4 per cent. Presbyterians, 6·2 per cent. Methodists, and 5·6 per cent. members of other Religious Denominations. In 1891 Roman Catholics formed 26·3 per cent.; Protestant Episcopalians, 29·5 per cent.; Presbyterians, 34·1 per cent.; Methodists, 5·4 per cent.; and members of all other Denominations, 4·7 per cent. of the population of the City as then constituted.

The following Statement shows the Educational status of the Inhabitants of the City of Belfast in 1891 and 1901, in so far as relates to the degrees of elementary education relative to which inquiry was made on the Census Forms, the numbers on which the per-centages are based being those for the City as constituted in the respective years:— Education. (Tables xxx. and xxxiii.)

From the above it will be seen that whereas, according to the Returns of 1891, only 71·5 per cent. of the Inhabitants, at all ages, could "read and write," in 1901, 75·8 per cent. could do so; that the per-centage of the population who could "read only" in 1891 was 9·0, and in 1901, 5·1; and that the per-centage of the "illiterate" fell from 19·5 in 1891 to 19·1 in 1901.

In 1891, 8·7 per cent. of the inhabitants aged five years and upwards were illiterate (7·7 per cent. of the males and 9·5 of the females); in 1901 the per-centage was 7·7 (6·9 of the males and 8·3 of the females).

Religious Professions and Education. (Table xxxiii.) Taking Religious Professions and Education in combination, it appears that in 1901, excluding children under five years of age, 12·2 per cent. of Roman Catholics, 8·4 per cent. of Protestant Episcopalians, 4·8 per cent. of Presbyterians, 4·6 per cent. of Methodists, and 1·4 per cent. of "all other Denominations" were illiterate.

School Attendance. (Table xxxviii.) The number of children attending school in the City of Belfast, according to the Census of 1891 (week ending 30th May), was 38,965; or 48·0 per cent. of persons aged 5 years and under 20 in the City as then constituted; in 1901 the number returned (for week ending 11th May) was 58,015 or 54·1 per cent. of the persons aged 5 and under 20.

The Sick. (Table xii.) In 1891 the number of persons in the City of Belfast (as then constituted) returned as Sick on the night of the Census, was 2,082, or one in every 123 of the population; in 1901 the number so returned was 2,781, or one in every 126 of the population; of the latter number 878 were at their own homes, and 1,903 were in hospital.

Pauperism. (Table xiii.) The number of persons returned in 1891 as receiving relief under the Poor Law System was 3,274, or one in every 78 of the population; of this number 2,364 were inmates of the Workhouse, and 310 were in receipt of outdoor relief; in 1901 the number returned was 3,629, or one in every 96 of the population; 3,359 of these being in the Workhouse, and 270 on outdoor relief.

Marriages, Births, and Deaths. (Table xiv.) For the purposes of Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages the Poor Law Union forms a "Superintendent Registrar's District." Each Union or Superintendent Registrar's District is divided into Dispensary Districts for the Medical Relief of the Poor under the Medical Charities Act; which Districts, save in a few instances, are identical with the Registrars' Districts. Each Dispensary District is composed of a certain number of District Electoral Divisions.

According to the Returns of the Registrar-General, the number of Marriages registered in the Poor Law Union of Belfast during the ten years ending 31st March, 1901, was 26,981, equal to an average annual rate of 8·2 per 1,000 of the population. The number registered in the whole of Ireland during the same period affords an average annual rate of 4·8 per 1,000.

The number of Births registered in the Union during the ten years was 108,797, affording an average annual rate of 33·0 per 1,000 of the population, the average yearly rate for the whole of Ireland during the same period being 23·0 per 1,000.

The Deaths registered during the decennium amounted to 77,543, being equal to an average annual rate of 23·6 per 1,000; the corresponding rate for the whole of Ireland was 18·2 per 1,000.

Emigration. (Table xli.) The number of Emigrants during the ten years ending 31st March, 1901, who stated that they were from the County of Antrim or City of Belfast, amounted to 14,946 (7,906 males and 7,040 females); the number for the decade ending 31st March, 1891, was 45,469; for that ending 31st March, 1881, 59,431; for that ending with March, 1871, 54,670; and for that ending with March, 1861, 77,516, making a total of 252,032 for the fifty years.

NOTE.—The plan of classification in the foregoing Table is the same as that adopted in former Censuses, and may be thus described:—

The value or condition of a house, as to its quality, may be considered to depend mainly on—

1st, its extent, as shown by the number of rooms; 2nd, its quality, as shown by the number of its windows, and 3rd, its solidity or durability, as shown by the material of its walls and roof. If numbers be adopted to express the position of every house in a scale of each of these elements, and if the numbers thus obtained for every house be added together, a new series of numbers will be produced, giving the position of each house in a scale compounded of all the elements, i.e., their actual state.

Four classes have been adopted, and the result is, that in the lowest of the four classes are comprised houses principally built of mud or other perishable material, having only one room and window; in the third a better description of house, varying from one to four rooms and windows; in the second, what might be considered a good farm house, having from five to nine rooms and windows; and in the first class all houses of a better description than the preceding.

The accommodation which the houses afford has also been arranged under four classes, viz:—

First Class accommodation consisting of 1st class houses, occupied by one family.

Second Class accommodation consisting of 2nd class houses, occupied by one family, or of 1st class houses, occupied by two or three families.

Third Class accommodation comprising 3rd class houses, with one family each, or 2nd class houses, with two or three families, or 1st class houses occupied by four or five families.

Fourth Class accommodation includes all 4th class houses, 3rd class houses with more than one family, 2nd class houses with four or more families, and 1st Class houses inhabited by six or more families.
